Rules Guidelines Regulations

General Rules and Regulations

- Premiums will not be paid on animals or articles removed from the Fair before it closes UNLESS special approval of the superintendent of the department has been given.
- All stock and other articles must be entered in the name of the owner. Dairy products, fruits, grain, vegetables and domestic manufactured must have been made or raised by the exhibitor thereof. Descriptive labels, in accordance with the entries, can be secured from the superintendents who shall attach them to the articles and allow them to remain during the Fair.
- No exhibitor shall compete against himself either directly or indirectly, and any person entering borrowed animals, articles, vegetables or other products, or making fraudulent representations in reference to any exhibit will forfeit all premiums which may have been awarded. The Association also reserves the right to accept or reject any entry made for any premium offered and no premium will be paid unless all requirements are fulfilled. Premiums earned will be paid by check and those checks will be mailed to the exhibitor no later than November 1st of the current year. Any check not cashed within 60 days of issue date will be considered a donation to the Fair Association.
- The Association will employ a watchman on the grounds at night and exercise due care, but they will assume no responsibility for any loss or damage from any cause that may occur to any animal or article exhibition, and upon this condition only are entries received.
- The Fair Association assumes no responsibility for injuries caused by any animal during the Fair.

Rules and Regulations – Governing All Entries on Livestock

- All entries must meet Health Requirements as prescribed by the State Department of Agriculture.
- Rochester Fair requires that all domestic animals i.e. dogs, cats, horses, cattle, and sheep etc. be immunized by veterinarian for rabies at least 30 days before attending the Fair.
- All registration papers must be checked for identity and age before showing.
- Each exhibitor must bring to the ring registration papers on all animals to be show in the Get or Sire and Produce of Dam classes for identification purposes. No animal may be shown out of its age class. All registered animals must be shown in purebred class. All animals must be owned prior to show date. Animals registered in the name of one or more members of the same family, entered from the same farm, may be shown in the Exhibitors Herd, Dairy Herd, and Breeder's Young Herd. No premium will be awarded unless the entry is meritorious. In case of entries with no competition, one half of the first place premium may be paid and then only, if in the opinion of the judges, the entry is meritorious and warrant recognition.
- Entries must be made on printed forms and in accordance with the instructions thereon, giving the class, lot number, animal's age, record number, name and address of the breeder, and other necessary information required. No person will be allowed to converse with the judges during their examination except the superintendent of the department. Animals kept on the same farm and owned by the owner of minor children of the owner may be entered in groups from the fair. No Award will be given to an unsound animal.
- The Association does not anticipate that it will be necessary to pro-rate or defer premiums but, if on account of weather, failure to receive state aid or other cause beyond its control, and there are not sufficient funds, the association reserves the right to do so.

Health Regulations

For 2016 New Hampshire Fair and Shows

SEC. I. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection: All cattle, sheep, goats, swine, equine, camelids (llamas & alpacas), poultry and ratites entering the State of New Hampshire from other states must be accompanied by a "Certificate of Veterinary Inspection" signed by an Accredited Veterinarian. This Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall indicate the health status of the animals, poultry and other species involved, including results of any required tests and a statement that the animals are not known to be inflected with or exposed to any infectious or contagious disease. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, which has been issued for a New Hampshire fair / show, will remain in force for the entire 2015 show season except when an animal has been excluded from exhibition for any reason. In such case, the excluded animal will need a new Certificate of Veterinary Inspection as outlined above prior to its next fair. Exhibitors must check with each state they plan to enter to ensure that they have met that state's import requirements. Each animal listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must have individual, official identification listed on the document. As well, a list of the fairs and shows attended through the season, with USPS addresses

and dates of attendance, must be attached to the document at all times. **SEC. II. Permanent Identification:** All cattle, sheep, goats, swine, camelids, cervidae, poultry, and ratites must be individually identified by permanent metal or plastic tag, legible tattoo or microchip (providing a reader is available). **SEC. III. Permanent Identification:** Ratites, Camelids, Swine and/or Poultry: Prior permit must be obtained and the number must appear on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Permits may be obtained by calling: (603) 2712404 Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 am - 4:00 p.m. **A. GENERAL GUIDELINES** a. All animals must be in proper physical condition, be properly identified and free of visual evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease at time of arrival. Specific diseases and conditions which will disqualify an animal for entry are identified for each species in the following sections of the rules. Animals of any species with open or draining wounds should not be approved for entry. **b. REMINDER:** ALL sheep and goats of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within state must possess a USDA approved individual identification tag, tattoo, or electronic implant consistent with the requirements of the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program. Information on approved tags, tattoos and electronic implants is available from the New Hampshire Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food at 603-271-2404 or from the USDA APHIS office in Sutton, MA at 508-865-1421. **c.** All livestock must have proper identification. For animals identified by microchip, readers should be available at the fairgrounds. **d. SEE INDIVIDUAL REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH SPECIES LISTED BELOW.** **e. IMPORTANT NOTE:** *It shall be the responsibility of show superintendents to eject each animal showing indications of contagious disease.* **B. EXHIBITOR SELF-CERTIFICATION** **a. NEW THIS YEAR:** In order to improve exhibitor involvement in the exclusion of unfit or at-risk animals, the department has put together a *Fair Exhibitor's Self-Certification of Animal Health*. This **does not supersede** any of the guidelines or requirements contained herein. This also **should not replace** fair personnel or a veterinarian in the process of checking animals into the fair. Rather, it is intended to both improve the efficiency of the check-in process and make exhibitors more aware of and accountable for the health status of their animals throughout the entire fair season. If necessary, this system should also allow for a more rapid trace back to the source of a disease incident. This assessment and certification should be completed no more than 24 hours prior to the animal(s) entering the fair grounds. At the time of entry, it should be reviewed, along with each animal, by the party responsible for checking animals into the fair. The department supports any efforts by each fair to adopt the completion of said certificate by all exhibitors as a necessary entrance requirement. The certificate should be kept with the animals and should be available for review at any time by fair personnel. **C. RABIES RECOMMENDATIONS:** **a.** The State Veterinarian recommends that all domestic animals should be immunized for rabies at least 30 days before attending the fairs. Domestic animals that do not have a licensed rabies immunization available (i.e., rabbits, pigs, and goats) may be immunized "extra-label". They can still receive the rabies shot, but it is not recognized as an immunized animal. It is highly recommended that all animals displayed at the fairs be restrained in a manner that would not allow the public to be bitten or exposed to saliva. Rabies vaccines for show participants should be administered by a licensed veterinarian so as to assure the efficacious handling and administration of the vaccine. **D. RINGWORM:** **a.** Ringworm infection or any condition consistent with ringworm infection should exclude an animal from exhibition. An exception could be made for an animal which has been under the treatment of a veterinarian for the ringworm infection for at least 21 days when the veterinarian certifies in writing that duration of treatment and that the lesion is no longer infectious to others. This is a reasonable manner in which to mitigate risk to animal and public health from a relatively common disease condition without excluding excessive numbers of animals. Exhibitors should be made aware of the need to consult a veterinarian well in advance to arrange treatment sufficient to meet this standard. **E CATTLE:** **a.** New Hampshire Animals - See Sec. II, Permanent Identification required. All cattle must originate from non-quarantined Tuberculosis negative herds and Brucellosis negative herds under state supervision; no further papers required **b.** Out-of-State Animals - See Sec. I and II. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and Permanent Identification required. All cattle originating from Tuberculosis accredited-free and Brucellosis classified-free states and Canadian provinces may enter the state of New Hampshire without testing. Cattle not originating from Tuberculosis accredited-free and Brucellosis classified-free states and Canadian provinces must meet the following requirements: **i.** All cattle must originate from Tuberculosis negative and Brucellosis negative, non-quarantine herds and must have been tested within 30 days for Brucellosis and within 60 days to Tuberculosis prior to entry for the first show of the current season. **ii.** Cattle under 18 months of age which are official vaccinates may enter New Hampshire without a Brucellosis test, but the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must show a record of such vaccination. **iii.** Calves under 179 days of age from Tuberculin negative herds under supervision tested within one year may enter the state without a test, if properly identified as progeny of a tuberculin tested dam. **STEERS, SPAYED HEIFERS & OXEN** must meet the same requirements as stated above for Tuberculosis. No Brucellosis requirement's. **G GOATS:** **a.** New Hampshire Animals - See Sec. II, Permanent Identification required. All goats must originate from non-quarantined herds and be clinically free from infectious and communicable diseases including lymphadenitis, staphylococcal infection, foot rot, contagious ecthyma (sore mouth), scabies or scrapie; nor shall they be progeny of goats known to be infected with scrapie. **b.** Out-of-State Animals - See Sec. I and Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and Permanent Identification required. All goats originating from Tuberculosis accredited-free and Brucellosis classified-free states and Canadian provinces may enter the state of New Hampshire without testing. Goats not originating from Tuberculosis accredited-free and Brucellosis classified-free states and Canadian provinces must meet the following requirements: **i.** All goats 6 months of age or older must originate from non-quarantined, Tuberculosis negative and Brucellosis negative herds and must have been tested within 30 days for Brucellosis and within 60 days to Tuberculosis prior to entry for the first show of the current season. **ii.** All goats under 6 months of age must be identified as progeny of a negative Brucellosis and Tuberculosis tested dam. **iii.** All goats must be clinically free from all other infectious and communicable diseases including lymphadenitis, staphylococcal infection, foot rot, contagious ecthyma (sore mouth), scabies or scrapie, and shall not be progeny of goats known to be infected with scrapie. **c.** Goats Enrolled in the Voluntary Scrapie Program - In order to lower

the risk of scrapie transmission, goat herds that are enrolled in the scrapie eradication program should follow the following guidelines: i. Be kept separate from non-enrolled goats by a vacant pen, a barn alley, or a solid physical barrier (such as metal, wood, canvas) sufficient to prevent any physical contact between enrolled and non enrolled goats. ii. Limit contacts in the show or sales ring to minimize risk of scrapie transmission. These contacts take place between animals off the herd's premises and not during or immediately after kidding. Limited contacts do not include commingling, which means the grouping of animals together with free physical contact. d. Prevent contact with kidding animals at exhibits or sales. Kidding increases the exposure potential. **geny of goats known to be infected with scrapie.** **SWINE:** a. New Hampshire Animals - See Sec. II, Permanent Identification required. All swine must originate from non-quarantined, Brucellosis and Pseudo rabies Free herds and be clinically free from all other infectious and communicable diseases b. Out-of-State Animals - See Sec. I, II and III, Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, Permanent Identification and Permit required. All swine shall be Brucellosis Validated or progeny of non-quarantined Brucellosis Validated herd or originate from a validated Brucellosis-free state. All swine shall have a Pseudo-rabies (PRV) negative test within 30 days of entry or originate from a Qualified Pseudorabies Negative herd or Pseudorabies class IV or free state. **SHEEP:**a. New Hampshire Animals - See Sec. II, Permanent Identification required. All sheep must originate from a non-quarantined flock and animals must not have been exposed to scrapie, scabies or any other contagious or infectious disease, and shall not be the direct progeny (first generation) of any animal diagnosed as having scrapie.b. Out-of-State Animals - See Sec. I and II. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and permanent identification required. All sheep must originate from aninspected, non-quarantined flock; the Certificate of Veterinary Inspect shall state that the animals have not been exposed to scrapie, scabies or any other contagious or infectious disease; anthe animal shall not be the progeny of a sire or dam that was infected with scrapie. c. Sheep Enrolled in the Voluntary Scrapie Program - In order to lower the risk of scrapie transmission, sheep flocks that are enrolled in the scrapieradication program should follow the following guidelines: i. Be kept separate from non-enrolled sheep by a vacan pen, a barn alley, or a solid physical barrier (such as metal, wood, canvas) sufficient to preventany physical contact between enrolled and non- enrolled sheep. ii. Limit contacts in the show or sales ring to minimize risk of scrapie transmission. These contacts take place between animals off the flock's premises and not during or immediately after lambing. Limited contacts do not include commingling, which means the grouping of animals together with free physical contact. iii. Prevent contact with lambing animals at exhibits or sales. Lambing increases the exposure potential. **HORSES:** a. New Hampshire Animals – A negative USDA-approved Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test (i.e. Coggins or ELISA) within the previous twelve months is recommended. b. Out-of-State Animals - See Sec. I. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection required. All equines entering the State of New Hampshire must be accompanied by a valid negative A.G.I.D. or ELISA (Coggins) test for Equine Infectious Anemia conducted within six months prior to entry. Entry permit not required. **NOTE:** *It is strongly recommended that Show Management examine health certificates and EIA test papers for all horses. It is also recommended that all horses have EEE, tetanus, and equine herpes virus vaccines no less than 14 days and no more than one year prior to the date of the fair in addition* **POULTRY:** a. New Hampshire Poultry - All poultry over 5 months of age must have been tested within one year for, and found negative to Salmonella Pullorum and avian influenza, identified by official leg band and must be progeny of Pullorum clean stock and free of all infectious and contagious diseases and exposure thereto. Out-of-State Poultry - See Sec. I, II and III. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection or NPIP VS Form 9-3 and Permit required. All poultry over 5 months of age must have been tested within one year for, and found negative to Salmonella Pullorum and avian influenza and be identified by official leg band. All poultry under 5 months must be progeny of Pullorum clean stock and free of all infectious and contagious diseases and exposure thereto. **CERVIDAE, CAMELIDS AND Bison's to the rabies vaccine.**

Dept. 01 Dairy Cattle

1. Dairy Cattle exhibitors will be paid \$200 per head for animals over 6 months old and for the 10 day duration of the fair. For Exhibitors for whom a 10 day commitment is too much we now offer a 5 day duration. You may choose from opening Friday thru Tuesday OR Wednesday thru closing Sunday. These exhibitors will be paid \$75 per head for animals over 6 months old.
2. See the General Rules & Regulations Governing Livestock Entries; and the New Hampshire Health Regulations.
3. All animals will be subject to inspections shortly after arrival. Any animal that in the judgement of the Fair vet should not be displayed will be sent home.
4. The Superintendent reserves the right to limit entries and to balance the number of dairy breeds to promote varied display. Entries are due and stated date with preference to prior year exhibitors.
5. Exhibitor Award goes to the livestock exhibitor who excels in the following area: Agricultural Promotion, Animal Husbandry, and Positive interaction with fellow exhibitors, patrons, and staff.
6. **To be eligible for premiums entries must be submitted to the fair office or through our online entry system BY SEPT 1ST.**

Dept. 02 Youth Dairy Show

All exhibitors must have their animals on the Fairgrounds by Friday at 9pm proceeding the weekend of their show. Animals must remain on the grounds until the Sunday of their show weekend until 4pm in order to be eligible for premiums.

Our Youth Shows are open to all youngsters, however to be eligible for premiums you must own or lease your animal.

1. All Exhibitors must follow the General Animal Show Rules located elsewhere in this book.
2. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry in each class for each breed.
3. In Fitting & Showmanship classes a calf or yearling must be used unless a cow is the only animal the exhibitor has to show.
4. **To be eligible for premiums entries must be submitted to the fair office or through our online entry system BY SEPT 1ST.**

1. Novice Showmanship – Under the age of 8
2. Junior Showmanship – Ages 8 to 13
3. Senior Showmanship – Age 14-21
4. Spring Heifer Calf – March 1 to April 30
5. Winter Heifer Calf – December 1 to February 28
6. Fall Heifer Calf – September 1 to November 30
7. Summer Yearling Heifer – June 1 to August 30
8. Spring Yearling Heifer – March 1 to May 31
9. Winter Yearling Heifer – December 1 to February 28
10. Fall Yearling Heifer - September 1 to November 30 (not in milk yearlings that have calved will show as a two year old)
11. Junior Champion – Winners of Class 5 thru 11 Rosette awarded; no premium.
12. Two Year Old Cow – September 1 to August 31
13. Three Year Old Cow - September 1 to August 31
14. Four Year Old Cow or Older – Born on or before August 31
15. Dry Cow – any cow that has calved, but is not in milk and not shown in any of the above classes.
16. Senior Champion Cow – Winners of classes 13, 14, and 15. Rosette awarded; no premium.
17. Grand Champion – Winners of 12 and 16. Rosette awarded; no premium.
18. Produce of Dam – Two females, any age, the produce of one cow, one owner.
19. Dam and Daughter – A cow and one daughter, any age, one owner. (comprised 2 dam/daughter groups)

20. Herd – 3 females, any age, of same breed owned by exhibitor. One entry per exhibitor.
21. Herdsmanship – Exhibitors will be judged on the cleanliness and appearance of the animals and politeness and informative attitude toward the public. (The care and feeding of the animals is sole responsibility of the Exhibitor.)

General Rules: Open Competition

1. No Riders anywhere on the Fair Grounds.
2. No Duals or Chains, Not allowed.
3. No step on sled allowed at any time.
4. No four wheel drive tractors (However, 4 wheel drive is permitted on Unlimited Class Only).
5. Cut tires and radials allowed (With exception of duals and chains)
6. Any bolt-on or secured weights are permitted. If any weight comes off during pulling the tractor will be disqualified.
7. The pulling point face will not exceed 20” in height and not less than 18” from the center axel (18” measurement is from the back of hole), (20” measurement shall be at highest pulling face). Including washers or spacers to attain height.
8. When hooking on the drag, drivers will put the tractors in neutral, raise hands and remain seated during the pull.
9. All tractors must have working brakes.
10. Drivers must have valid driver’s license. Those under the age of 18 must have written parental/guardian permission and supervised by said person.
11. No alcohol to be consumed during pull.
12. Only one person allowed on the tractor.
13. Attention shall be given to the hook person and the flag person.
14. Tractors may have two tries to achieve full pull. Pin must fall completely to be classified as a full pull. Measurements shall be taken from the mark on the pin to the rear center of the drag.
